### From the Principal

#### NSW Primary Principals Association State Conference

This is the normal time of year that I attend the NSW Primary Principals Association (NSWPPA) annual conference in Sydney, however, due to COVID it is on via zoom. The theme for 2020 is “2020 adjusting the focus.” The calibre of the speakers is just as high and I’m sure that their talks will still challenge us, reinforce our beliefs and make us rethink, learn from and refresh our thinking so that we can bring ideas back to our schools.

#### 2021 Budget

Last week all schools were emailed their proposed budget for 2021. As a result, next week, I will start to plan for next year at Havenlee School. We have \$3,220,721 to run our school next year (this is almost the same as last year). This includes all permanent staffing costs.

Specific Funding is as follows:

Socio-Economic/ Equity background \$143,789

Aboriginal background \$42,465

SSP supplementary funding \$271,615

With the Specific funding I will endeavour to employ as many additional staff as possible to support our students. As soon as I have finalised the budget, I will let you know.

#### Strategic Improvement Plan

All Department of Education Schools across the state are finishing up their current school plans and are now starting to think about their vision for the next 4 years. The new school plan will be called the “Strategic Improvement Plan”. The Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) is a working document that details the steps each school will take to improve learning outcomes, and the achievement and growth of all students. To ensure continuous improvement, the Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) reflects where a school is at and how it will further improve learning, teaching and leading. Each school will develop a comprehensive SIP in consultation with the school community, identifying student

outcomes to be achieved and connected to the budget. This process will be in the form of a situational analysis.

A situational analysis is an authentic and rigorous assessment of each school’s current state and is used to inform each school’s improvement journey in learning, teaching and leading. As part of the situational analysis, every school collects qualitative and quantitative data, collates evidence, collaborates widely (including the school community), and engages with research. Community engagement is a critical factor for improving the progress, achievement and wellbeing of students. When schools, families and the broader community work together to develop positive connections, students thrive. As a result, Havenlee School will be consulting with you throughout the process of developing our new Strategic Improvement Plan. Watch this space. ## Beeswax Wraps

Our School to Work program has expanded into Beeswax Wraps. These are an environmentally friendly alternative to single use plastic wrap.

You can use beeswax wraps to:

- Wrap sandwiches, fruit, vegetables and cheese
- Cover plates, bowls, cups and jugs
- Keep flies off food
- To wrap a bouquet of flowers
- Make a pouch or snack bag.

You just use the warmth and pressure of your hands to shape and mould them over or around your food or bowl.

Cost: \$4.00 for a SMALL wrap (20cm x 20cm)

\$6.00 MEDIUM (27cm x 30cm or 30cm x 30cm)

\$8.00 LARGE (35cm x 35cm)

We can also revive your well used wraps for \$2.00 per wrap.

Please call the school, email or write in your child's communication book if you would like to purchase a beeswax wrap. They can also be delivered on Wednesdays with our worm wee and castings.

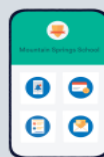

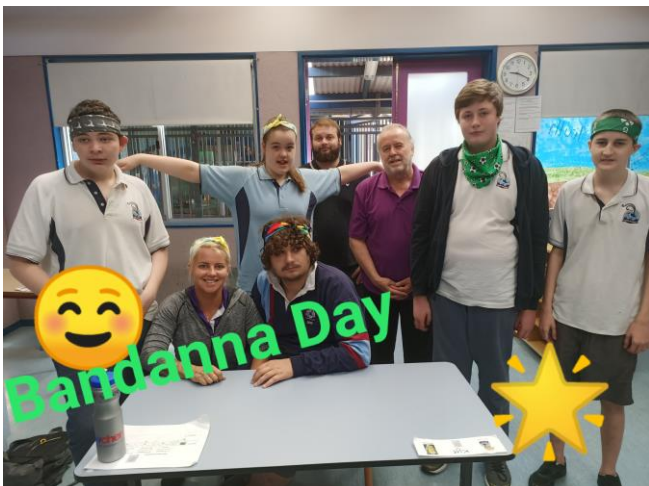
