# From the Principal

### **Transport and Road Safety**

Student and community safety are a priority at Havenlee School. Earlier this year, Shoalhaven Council and the local bus companies identified that the Kiss and Drop zone shared by Havenlee School and North Nowra School was an area of high risk for pedestrians and road users before and after school. As a result, through consultation with a number of parties, a range of changes to improve safety will occur starting on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November. These include:

- Improved line marking and signage in the Kiss and Drop Zone and in the surrounding streets
- No Right Turn out of the staff car park onto Judith Drive
- North Nowra School buses picking up and dropping off in Page Avenue only

New signage and road markings have been installed during Term 3 2021 school holidays, and as a result:

- North Nowra School families can use the Kiss and Drop Zone in the mornings for drop off but not the afternoons
- Before and After School program students will continue to use the Kiss and Drop for entry and departure
- 3. North Nowra School students will depart via the Page Avenue and Nellore Place gates (back gates) at the end of each school day

### 2022 budget

Last week all schools were emailed their proposed budget for 2022. As a result, I have started to plan for next year at Havenlee School. We have \$3 241 089 to run our school next year (this is almost the same as last year). This includes all permanent staffing costs.

Specific Funding is as follows:

- Socio-Economic/ Equity background \$136 860
- Aboriginal background \$43 526
- SSP supplementary funding \$291 986




# Sun Safety

### Individual Art Support

Creative Connections also offer 1:1 art mentoring for NDIS participants. Sessions are avaliable at the studio on Kinghorne St Nowra, or we can travel to a participants home.

1:1 support can include personal supports with art and craft skills, completing projects of your choice or learning art and craft techniques.

1:1 support sessions are usually 2 hours for adults or 1 hour for under 18's.

### Who is it suitable for?

A friendly, safe, and welcoming program for people living with a disability or mental health support needs.

You don't need ant artistic skills or experience. There is no wrong way of making art! You will get to try a variety of different art processes.

In the group, we have different projects and art materials each week. If you prefer to bring your own materials or work on your own projects within the group, we will provide encouragement and assistance as required.













Participants coming for individual sipport can further explore their creative ideas and develop skills according to their interests.

You don't need a support person/worker with you to attend the group, but you are welcome to bring a suppport person if you like.

You will be supported to work towards your personal goals including making friends., building positive routines, and expressing your creativity in a safe space.

### Who facilitates this group?

The lead facilitator is Jessie Surplice, a trained artist and disability/mental health worker. Jess has a degree in Visual Art, a degree in Psycological Science, and a Certificate IV in Disability. She has extensive experience working with people with disabilities and mental health conditions, as a support worker, group facilitator, and program coordinator.

### What type of funding can I use?

You can use NDIS funing (Self-Managed or Plan Managed). There are no out-of-pocket costs to you if you are using NDIS fundin.

Prices are charged at NDIS support worker rates using Core funding or Community Participation funding.

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### **Vaccine Information**

People aged 16 years and above are now eligible for a COVID-19 vaccination.

Vaccination appointments are avaliable at more than 3,000 locations across NSW, including GPs and pharmacies. More appointments will become aaliable as supply increases, so keep checking for new appointments in coming weeks.

Young people can catch and spread COVID-19. More than 30% of cases of COVID-19 in NSW are people under 20. For questions about vaccination, speak with your provider.

### Why get vaccinated?

People of all ages can get COVID-19.

If you live in an area of concern, the chances you will come in to contact with the virus are higher. Two doses of a vaccine will:

- Reduce the chance you will be infected with COVID-19 by 60-80%
- Give you around 90% protection against hospitalisation and death from COVID-19 if you are infected
- Significantly reduces the spread of COVID-19 to others. Even if you don't have symptoms or get sick, you can still pass the virus on to others. Getting vacinated also helps to protect those you live with and the community.

### If you are unwell, get tested

- You must not attend your vaccinatioon appointment if you have any COVID-19 symptoms.
- Get tested if you have th mildest of symptoms or even if you have been vaccinated.
- Self-isolate until you get a negative test result.
- Stay home if you're unwell
