From the Principal

COVID Update

Last week National Cabinet announced that the isolation period for positive COVID-19 cases would be reduced from 7 days to 5 days from Friday 9 September with the following caveats: This would apply to people with no symptoms at 5 days.

- 7 days isolation would remain for workers in high-risk settings including aged care, disability care and those providing care in the home.

It is important to note NSW Health is currently updating the [NSW Public Health Order \(PHO\)](#) to reflect National Cabinet's announcement and once it is published, we will advise you of any further changes.

The department's position, in line with the decision by National Cabinet and reflecting the changes to community settings, is as follows. In mainstream school settings (including boarding schools) staff, students and visitors who have tested positive to COVID-19 must:

- complete 5 days of isolation from the date they tested positive

- be symptom-free before returning to school, if symptoms remain after Day 5 they must continue following NSW Health guidelines to self-isolate and undertake a rapid antigen test (RAT)
- complete a RAT and return a negative result before attending school on Days 6 and 7 after testing positive to COVID-19, and
- wear a mask on Days 6 and 7 when attending school (for all staff and those students aged 12 years and older).

Due to the higher risk associated with some school settings and activities, the 7-day isolation period will remain for staff, students and visitors who have tested positive to COVID-19 and work at or attend:

- schools for specific purposes (SSPs)
- support units
- assisted transport
- overnight excursions

Staff, students and visitors may return to these higher-risk settings after isolating for 7 days from the date they tested positive if they are symptom-free on their seventh day of isolation. Masks continue to be required for all workers who support our students with a greater risk of severe illness if they were to acquire COVID-19 in SSPs, support units and some mainstream classrooms, and for staff working in Assisted Travel programs.

All staff, students and visitors who test positive to COVID-19 should continue to follow the [NSW Health guidelines](#) in addition to the relevant Department of Education advice.



There are no changes to NSW Health requirements for household and close contacts.

That is students and staff at Havenlee school who become close contacts or household contacts need to isolate for 7 days.

Sensory Climbing Dome

I would like to say a big “thank you” to the Havenlee P&C who donated the funds for the school to purchase a small sensory climbing dome. It has been installed next to the new sensory swing. It is a favourite choice of play equipment for the smaller students.



Havenlee's Got Talent and Footy Colours Day

Last Monday the school put on the very popular “Havenlee's Got Talent” Show. I know that there were many students who had been madly practising for both individual and group items. Students could choose to either do live or pre-recorded acts. The live performances were videoed and we plan to show an edited version of the show at Presentation Assembly. It was great to see so many students bravely up the front having a go at singing, dancing, telling jokes etc. Congratulations to Grace who won the individual section of the show and for Tea Tree who won the group section.



To keep in with the fun theme of Havenlee's Got Talent, we also had a Footy Colours Mufti day. We raised \$65 for the worthy cause of cancer research.



RAP Award Party

17 students received enough RAP awards during Term 3 to be eligible for the Principal RAP Award Party, held today. Students played with balloons, danced, sang and played percussion instruments along to music. Each student received a party bag to take home. Congratulations to those students for striving to be SAFE, RESPONSIBLE and RESPECTFUL this term.

Establishment of New Class

Last week we were given the official paperwork to start a new class at the beginning of Term 4. The new class will be situated in the old staffroom and be called "Blue Gum". There will be 4 new students starting in Term 4: Ming (yr 11), Harrison (Yr 10), Mackenzie (yr 5) and Abel (yr 1). As these students are all different ages, there will be a bit of movement between existing classes. Notes will go home at the beginning of next term for those students who will be moving classes. We welcome the new students and their families to the Havenlee Community.

2023 students transitioning

At the last placement panel, 6 students were offered positions at Havenlee School for the beginning of 2023 (replacing yr 12 leavers and filling up the new class). During Term 4 each of the new students will be given the opportunity to start transitioning to Havenlee School, to help familiarise them with the routines, staff and other students at the school. The school will be employing an extra SLSO each day for this process to run smoothly as possible. There is one more space left for next year. It will be filled at the Term 4 week 3 placement panel.



Smoking at School

Smoking has been prohibited on DoE school sites since July 1988. The *Drugs in School* policy states “smoking on school premises, including school buildings, gardens, sports fields and car parks, is prohibited. This includes students, employees, visitors and other people who use school premises, including community groups”. The Smoke-free Environment Act 2000 makes a number of outdoor public places smoke-free. Smoking is banned within 4 metres of a pedestrian entrance to or exit from a public building in NSW which includes schools. This law is called the ‘4 metre law’. The law does not require signs to be displayed to indicate that smoking is not permitted within 4 metres of a pedestrian entrance to or exit to a school. On the spot fines of \$300 may apply to individuals who do not comply with the ‘4 metre law’.

I hope everyone has a safe and relaxing holiday.

We look forward to seeing everyone back at school on Monday 10th October for the beginning of Term 4.




