Australian Primary Principals Association (APPA) State Conference

This year the APPA is being held in Sydney and is combining with the NSW Primary Principal Association Conference. I will be attending the conference between the 1-4 November. The theme for 2022 is "reCONNECT, reENGAGE, reIMAGINE." The conference is a great professional learning and collaboration opportunity for educational leaders in primary schools across Australia. There is a range of outstanding speakers to challenge, reinforce our beliefs and learn from and refresh our thinking so that we can be re-energised in our schools.







The Department is rolling out New Syllabuses across K-10 next year. Because of limited opportunities over the last few years for teachers to engage in and become familiar with the new documents and resources (due to COVID), the Department of Education is providing 2 additional school development days – one in 2022 and one in 2023 – to support teachers' professional learning and development. The additional School Development day will be held on Monday 19 December 2022 (Tuesday 20 December is already a school development day). On Monday 19 December there will be minimal supervision.
