In week 4 all schools were emailed their proposed budget for 2023. As a result, I have started to plan for next year at Havenlee School. The Department of Education have allocated to Havenlee School \$3 325 163 to run the school next year (this is almost the same as last year). This includes all permanent staffing costs. Specific Funding is as follows: · Socio-Economic/ Equity background \$147 982

Aboriginal background \$44 313

 SSP supplementary funding \$291 986 With most of this funding, I will endeavour to employ as many additional staff as possible to support our students.

Weeks 7-11- Safe 'Responsible for my body'

In weeks 7-10 of this term the PBL focus is safe and students being responsible for their bodies. Explicit lessons are being taught in classrooms including following a 1,2,3 and complex instruction, waiting for a cue and purposefully acting with the intention of a specific result. This can be demonstrated in classroom activities, sport, work crews, following instructions and using equipment safely e.g. in the playground or using scissors in the classroom. PBL tickets are given out to students being responsible for their bodies.
