### From the Principal

#### Sorry Day

I would like to acknowledge that last Thursday (23/5) was National Sorry Day. The Department of Education recognises that in the past they had policies and practices that denied the education of Aboriginal students. They also accept that there is still much to be done to ensure all students have access to quality education. Sorry Day is part of reconciliation week (27 May- 3 June). The theme this year is “Be Brave. Make Change”. Havenlee School is committed to giving all students access to engaging individualised learning opportunities. We recognise the importance of connecting and collaborating with our local Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG) to work together to achieve better outcomes for all. To commemorate reconciliation week all students at Havenlee School did several activities including:

- Students were part of a special short assembly presentation on Monday (30/5). Classes shared with the rest of the school Aboriginal related work/activities they have been doing for Geography or other KLAS.
- “Sea of hands”. For 25 years the Sea of Hands has been a symbol of Solidarity with First Nations Peoples. Each student decorated a card hand however they liked, attached it to a large paddlepop stick and put it to the front garden to make an installation.
- Each class had the opportunity to use the sandpit to tell stories using the Aboriginal symbols.

#### Intensive Swimming and Hydrotherapy

Both the intensive swimming and hydrotherapy programs started back up last week. Targeted students are having two swimming lessons a week (Tuesdays and Thursdays) from now until the end of term. They are given the opportunity to learn specific swimming skills. Students who are not in the intensive swimming program are accessing the normal hydrotherapy program once a week either on a Monday or Wednesday. It is wonderful to watch the excited faces of the students back in the pool.

#### Boccia Competition

Congratulations to the Myrtle students who participated in this year’s interschool Boccia competition. After having a couple of years break, the students enjoyed their time at Bomaderry Sports Centre playing against students from support classes in the local area.

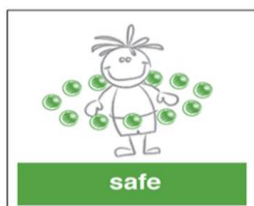
