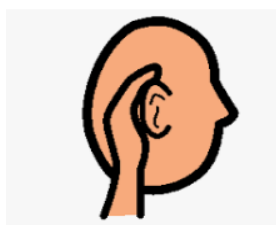

I didn't realise it, but did you know that cooking is a fantastic way to learn about things like: hygiene, safety, maths, measuring, 2D shapes and fine motor skills! Sounds like good brain food too!

Ingredients	Method
1 cup pure cream	<b>1</b> Preheat oven to 220°C (200°C fan-forced). Lightly flour a baking tray.
1 cup lemonade	
3 cup self-raising flour	<b>2</b> Sift flour and salt into a large bowl. Pour in lemonade and cream and mix to a soft sticky dough. Scrape onto a generously floured surface. Knead very lightly and press into 3 cm thick disc. Using a 6cm cutter, cut dough into rounds and place on a baking paper lined oven tray. Gently knead scraps of dough together, repeat pressing and cutting.
pinch of salt	
extra flour, for dusting	
jam and cream, to serve	<b>3</b> Lightly brush tops with a little extra cream and bake for 15-20 minutes or until browned and tops are browned.
	<b>4</b> Serve with jam and cream.
